

LINCOLN ROAD UNVEILS MAJOR ART INSTALLATION BY FACUNDO YEBNE IN CELEBRATION OF MIAMI BEACH PRIDE

Symbolizing Inclusivity, Unity and Resilience, the Sculptures Will Be on View from April 1 Through the End of Pride Month on June 30

MIAMI BEACH, FL (March 20, 2025) – In celebration of Miami Beach Pride and upcoming International Pride Month, [Lincoln Road](#), Miami Beach’s premier destination for dining, shopping and culture, will debut two major sculptures by emerging artist Facundo Yebne of [FLY Miami Art](#). The sculptures, which are crafted from resin and adorned with multicolored rubber ducks, will be on view from April 1 through June 30 and are meant to encourage dialogue around themes of inclusivity, unity and resilience. The choice of rubber ducks as the theme is deliberate, recontextualizing a universally nostalgic object to symbolize solidarity.

Positioned in Miami Beach’s dynamic commercial district, the installation invites viewers to engage in a deeper exploration of love and acceptance. The first sculpture, “Proud Love,” is an 8-foot-tall heart composed of approximately 5,000 rubber ducks a little over 2 inches in size, arranged in the colors of the Pride flag. Its design reflects the courage to love openly and celebrate love in all forms. The second sculpture, “UnityBeak,” is an emotionally powerful sculpture of two ducks kissing, crafted from around 16,000 rubber ducks just over 1 inch in size that come together to form a larger, more cohesive figure. The sculpture’s design emphasizes the idea that strength lies in numbers.

“I’m thrilled to have my work featured on Lincoln Road,” said artist Facundo Yebne. “Every piece I create reflects my journey, and seeing them displayed in such an iconic space is both humbling and exciting. I hope my art sparks genuine conversations, inspires viewers to reflect on their personal experiences with love and identity, and helps spread the love we all have inside.”

The installation not only enhances Lincoln Road’s physical space but also deepens the connection between art and community. The sculptures serve as a reminder that even in times of division, art can be

a source of joy, hope and connection.

“Lincoln Road has always been a place for inclusion and community,” said Lyle Stern, president of the Lincoln Road Business Improvement District. “The sculptures featured in this installation transcend traditional art forms; they reflect the values of acceptance and unity that are so important in today’s society. We are honored to host this powerful installation, which serves not only as a tribute to the LGBTQ+ community but also as a testament to the transformative power of love in bringing us together.”

In celebration of Miami Beach Pride, the entry planters and concrete bollards along Lincoln Road are wrapped in rainbow-hued sleeves, creating an intentionally playful arrangement of patterns. Each planter and bollard display a unique diagonal design, incorporating rainbow stripes that evoke local elements such as sun rays, wildflowers, terrazzo and breeze blocks, alongside variations of the pride flag and inclusive messaging.

Throughout Miami Beach Pride (March 27 – April 6) and further into International Pride Month (June), locals and visitors will have the opportunity to experience the colorful joy of pride through Yebne’s two towering sculptures.
